1. The petition challenges order dated 18th December, 2018 vide which the learned Tribunal has refused to grant interim relief at that stage.
2. The perusal of order passed by the learned Tribunal itself reveals that the learned Tribunal has observed that by granting an interim relief, an order or notice on termination, should not be stayed without giving an opportunity to hear other side in the interest of justice. In that view, the learned Tribunal has kept the matter on 13th February, 2019.
