1. In all these writ petitions, the petitioner has not stated in the petition that, he was party before the Trial Court. These writ petitions are

When a specific query was put to the learned counsel appearing for the petitioner that, whether the petitioner was party before the Courts below?, he is not in a position to make a correct statement. At one stage he submitted that, the petitioner was party in the lower Court proceedings, and after few minutes he submits that, the petitioner filed an application for assisting the Public Prosecutor/State.
