Rajendra Borkar, Resident Deputy Collector, MSD states that out of the employees of the petitioner, the said respondents will not requisition services of 479 employees (whose names appear in the List – C annexed to the letter dated 29th March 2019 addressed by the petitioner to the Respondent No.3) for election work of ensuing Lok Sabha Election to be held on 29th April 2019.
