1. Mr Mehta states that the account of the Respondent is closed. The Petitioner has received its dues. The Receiver was appointed of the asset, a mixer. That asset is in the yard of the Petitioner but is in the custody of the Court Receiver.

2. In view of the settlement of the account, Mr Mehta agrees and undertakes that the Petitioner will deliver possession of the asset to the Respondent. It is the Respondent's responsibility to lift the asset from the Petitioner's Yard at the Respondent's cost.

3. The Receiver now needs to be discharged. The Receiver stands discharged without passing accounts but on payment of his costs, charges and expenses by the Petitioner.
4. The Receiver is not required to visit the site to deliver physical possession to the Petitioner or the Respondents.
5. The Interim Application is disposed of in these terms.
