ORDER

[Order of the court was made by Justice M.M.SUNDRESH]

The petitioner is the wife of the detenu. She has come up with this petition seeking a direction to the respondent for production of her missing husband.

2. The learned Additional Public Prosecutor, on instructions, submitted that due to financial dispute, the detenu has left the matrimonial home. According to the learned



Additional Public Prosecutor, based on the complaint given by the petitioner, a case has been registered for man missing.

3. In view of the above, we are not inclined to keep this petition pending any longer. Thus, the Habeas Corpus petition stands closed, however, the 2nd respondent shall proceed with the investigation and as and when the detainee is traced, he should be produced before the jurisdictional Magistrate.
