PETITION FOR BAIL Under Sec. 439 Cr.P.C.

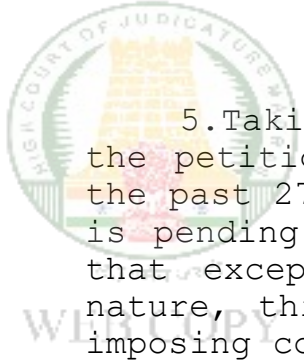
ORDER : The Court Made the following order :-

This petition has been filed by the petitioner/ sole accused seeking bail for the alleged offence under Sections 294(b), 506(i) and 500 of IPC.

2. Heard both sides

3. The learned counsel for the petitioner would submit due to previous enmity the defacto complainant has lodged a false complaint against the petitioner herein. He further submitted that the petitioner herein was arrested and remanded to judicial custody on 26.05.2019 and he is in custody for the past 27 days. He further submitted that no previous case is pending against the petitioner. He would also submit that except 506(i) of IPC all other offences are bailable in nature. Therefore he prayed to grant bail to the petitioner.

4. The learned Additional Public Prosecutor would submit that the petitioner herein has circulated notice containing defamatory statmenets as against one political party. Hence he strongly opposed to grant bail to the petitioner. However he fairly conceded that no previous case is pending against the petitioner.



5. Taking into consideration all the allegations made against the petitioner and also the fact the petitioner is in custody for the past 27 days and also considering the fact that no previous case is pending against the petitioner and also considering the fact that except 506(i) of IPC all other offences are bailable in nature, this Court is inclined to grant bail to the petitioner by imposing conditions:

[a] the petitioner is ordered to be released on bail on his executing a bond for a sum of Rs.10,000/- (Rupees ten thousand only) with two sureties each for a like sum to the satisfaction of the Judicial Magistrate, Rajapalayam.

[b] the petitioner shall report before the Respondent Police, daily at 10.30 A.M for a period of One Month and thereafter, as and when required for the interrogation.

[c] the petitioner shall not abscond either during investigation or trail.

[d] the petitioner shall not tamper with evidence or witness either during investigation or trail.

[e] On breach of any of the aforesaid conditions, the learned Magistrate/Trial Court is entitled to take appropriate action against the petitioner in accordance with law as if the conditions have been imposed and the petitioner released on bail by the learned Magistrate/Trial Court himself as laid down by the Hon'ble Supreme Court in P.K.Shaji vs. State of Kerala [(2005)AIR SCW 5560].

[f] If the accused thereafter absconds, a fresh FIR can be registered under Section 229A IPC.
