



therefore, the learned counsel appearing for the petitioner seeks indulgence of this Court to give a direction to the second respondent to consider the petitioner's representation and pass order thereon, within a time frame.

5.I have heard Mr.V.Anand, learned Government Advocate appearing for the respondents 1 to 3, who would submit that, the said representation of the petitioner, dated 27.06.2019, would be considered and decided, on merits and if need be, an enquiry under Section 68(2) of the Registration Act will be conducted by the second respondent, after giving notice to the petitioner as well as the fourth respondent.

6.Considering the said submissions made by both sides, this Court is inclined to dispose of this writ petition with the following directions:-

"that the second respondent is hereby directed to consider the representation of the petitioner dated 27.06.2019 and pass orders thereon, on merits and in accordance with law, after giving an opportunity of being heard to both the petitioner as well as the fourth respondent, by issuing separate notices to them and needful shall be done by passing final order, within a period of eight weeks from the date of receipt of a copy of this order.
