PRAYER: Writ Petition filed under Article 226 of the Constitution of India for issuance of Writ of Mandamus, directing the respondents to pay interest at the rate of 18% per annum, for the period of delay from 01.05.2018 to 21.09.2019, in paying the amounts paid towards the terminal and pension benefits of the petitioner namely EPF Employee's Contribution, Gratuity, Encashment of Earned/Sick Leaves and Commutated Value of Pension, within a time frame as may be fixed by this Hon'ble Court and without affecting his right to claim balance amounts towards those benefits.

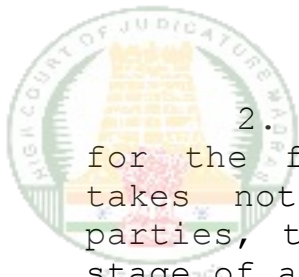

ORDER

This writ petition is filed for a direction to the respondents to pay interest at the rate of 18% per annum, for the period of delay from 01.05.2018 to 21.09.2019, in paying the amounts paid towards the terminal and pension benefits of the petitioner namely EPF Employee's Contribution, Gratuity, Encashment of Earned/Sick Leaves and Commutated Value of Pension, within a time frame as may be fixed by this Hon'ble Court and without affecting his right to claim balance amounts towards those benefits.



2. Mr.J.Senthil Kumaraiash, learned counsel takes notice for the first respondent and Mr.A.Swaminathan, learned counsel takes notice for the second respondent. By consent of both parties, the Writ Petition is taken up for final disposal at the stage of admission itself.

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3. According to the petitioner, he was appointed as 'Conductor' on 24.11.1981 and retired from service on 30.04.2018 as 'Traffic Inspector' on attaining the age of superannuation. His terminal benefits were settled only on 21.09.2019. The grievance of the petitioner is that, the respondents have not paid the interest for the delayed payment as per the judgment of the First Bench of this Court, dated 12.06.2015 in W.A.(MD)Nos.383 to 457 of 2015. He made representation to the respondents on 30.09.2019 and the respondents have not passed any orders on the representation. Hence, the petitioner has come out with the present writ petition.

4. Heard the learned counsel appearing for the petitioner and the learned counsel appearing for the respondents and perused the materials available on record.

5. This issue has already been decided by the First Bench of this Court referred to above. In view of the same, the respondents are directed to pay the interest at the rate of 6% for the delayed payment in twelve (12) equal monthly instalments on or before 10th day of every English Calendar month. The first instalment is to be paid on or before 10th day of March, 2020.

6. With the above direction on, the writ petition stands disposed of. No costs.
