ORDER:

The petitioners, who are accused in C.C.No.2003 of 2019 on the file of the XIX Metropolitan Magistrate at Kukatpally, Cyberabad, filed this Criminal Petition under Section 482 Cr.P.C. to quash the proceedings in the above C.C. A charge sheet came to be filed against the petitioners for the offences punishable under Sections 498-A of the Indian Penal Code and Sections 3 and 4 of the Dowry Prohibition Act, 1961.

During pendency of the Criminal Petition, I.A.Nos.2 and 3 of 2019 came to be filed by the second respondent to record the compromise and to compound the offences. Along with the petitions, a joint memo came to be filed, *inter alia*, stating that at the intervention of elders and well wishers, the parties have settled their disputes in terms of the compromise. The said joint memo has been supported by the affidavit of the second respondent.

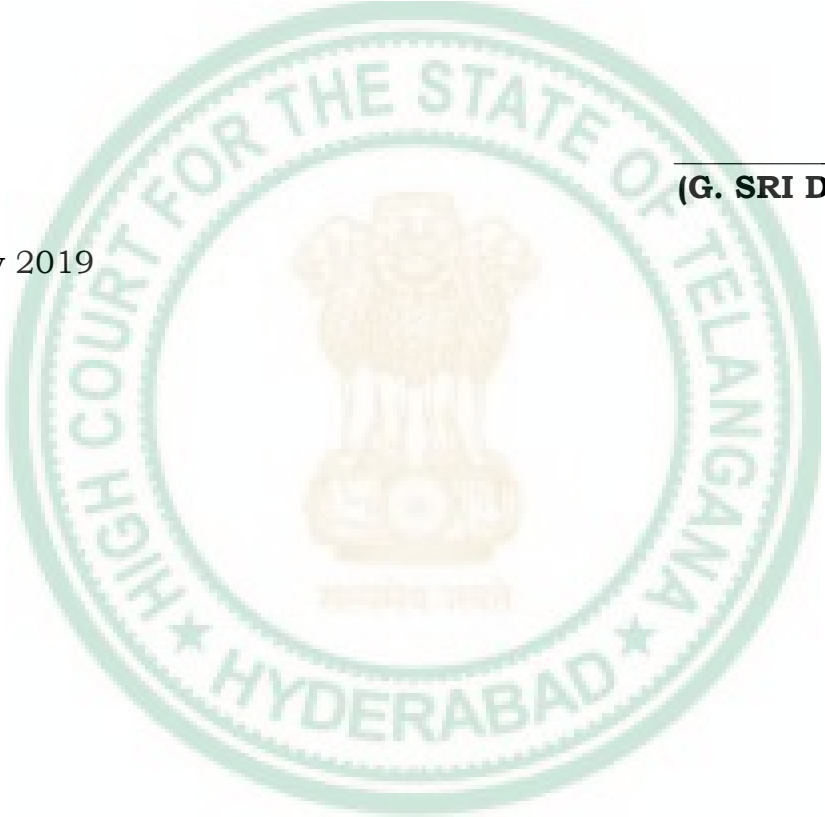
Today, both the parties are present before this Court and they were identified by their respective counsel. This Court, when examined, both the parties have stated that at the instance of the elders, they have settled the matter out of the Court and the second respondent has no objection for quashing the proceedings against the petitioner.

In the light of the compromise arrived at between the parties, the compromise memo filed by both the parties is recorded and I.A.Nos.2 and 3 of 2019 are ordered.

Accordingly, the Criminal Petition is allowed in terms of compromise, and the proceedings in C.C.No.2003 of 2019 on the file of the XIX Metropolitan Magistrate at Kukatpally, Cyberabad, against the present petitioners are hereby quashed.

Miscellaneous applications, if any, pending, shall stand closed.
