Petitioner has applied for anticipatory bail in FIR No. 0225, dated 17.12.2018, registered under Sections 457, 336, 506, 148, 149 IPC read with Sections 25, 27 of Arms Act, 1959, at Police Station Division-B, Police Commissionerate, District Amritsar. It is alleged that present petitioner accompanied by Lucky Sandherha, Rahul Kang and 8/10 unknown persons came outside house of complainant Balwinder Singh and started abusing him. Rahul Kang fired in air with his revolver and after threatening, they all went away. This incident happened on 17.12.2018, at 9:30 PM. Half an hour later of said incident i.e. at 10:00 PM, said persons came again and started raising lalkaras. They gave leg blows on the main gate of complainant. As the gate was not locked, the gate was opened and all said persons entered the house. Complainant and his family members ran away towards their roof and started shouting for help, on

which people of locality gathered there. Lucky Sandherha fired in air and ran away from spot.

The nature of incident shows that petitioner did not care for law and order. Two crimes were committed within a span of half hour to scare family of complainant. It is not a case of undue hardship. There is no ground to grant anticipatory bail to petitioner. Petition is thus dismissed.
