Prayer in this petition filed under Section 439 Cr.P.C. is for grant of regular bail to the petitioner in case FIR No.95 dated 13.09.2018 under Sections 406, 498-A, 313, 506, 417 IPC, registered at Police Station Women Cell, Patiala.

On 14.01.2019, this Court had passed the following order:-

“The parties are ad idem to have recourse of mediation first.

Lest it may prejudice the interest of the parties, without observing anything in the case, at this stage the applicant is admitted on interim bail for a specific period of 15 days so as to enable the parties to face the mediation, on his furnishing bail bonds/surety bonds to the satisfaction of Chief Judicial Magistrate/Duty Magistrate, Patiala.

Accordingly, parties are directed to appear before the

Mediator, Mediation and Conciliation Centre of this Court on 18.01.2019.

For awaiting report, list on 29.01.2019.”

Learned counsel for the parties are *ad idem* that the matter has been resolved between the parties and the settlement/agreement dated 25.02.2019 has been arrived at between them. Para 6 relates to the terms & conditions of the settlement/agreement.

Learned counsel for the complainant does not dispute the very settlement/agreement.

Accordingly, the present petition is allowed and the interim order dated 14.01.2019, whereby the petitioner was admitted on interim bail for a period of 15 days to enable the parties to face the mediation, is hereby made absolute. However, the petitioner shall furnish fresh bail bonds/surety bonds to the satisfaction of the trial Court.
