The present contempt petition has been filed for non-compliance of the order dated 21.4.2016, vide which, direction was given with regard to the arrears of family pension to the petitioner and other family members and to pay the due amount as per their entitlement.

Short reply by way of affidavit of Aswathy V.S. Sr. Deputy Accountant General, (Pension) on behalf of respondent No.3 dated 29.4.2019 filed in Court is taken on record. As per the same, the case of the petitioner was reviewed accordingly and admitted and the District Treasury Officer, Kapurthala has been directed to restore the ceased portion of family pension in favour of the petitioner (Annexure R-3/1).

In view of the above, the present contempt petition is dismissed.

Rule issued against the respondents stand discharged.

At this stage, learned counsel for the petitioner submits that only 50% of the pension has been released.

In case, the petitioner is aggrieved of the same, she is at liberty to challenge the Annexure R-3/1 in accordance with law.
