**AVNEESH JHINGAN, J (Oral):**

Learned counsel for the petitioner states that though the retiral benefits have been given but same are not properly calculated. The grievance raised is that petitioner is not treated at parity with the similarly situated employees. He seeks liberty to avail remedies in accordance with law for redressal of the surviving grievance.

Considering the fact that there is long drawn litigation and dispute is with regard to calculation on retiral benefits, it is desirable that petitioner file a detailed representation with his calculation within four weeks from today. In case representation is made, the same shall be considered in accordance with law and a reasoned

order be passed within three months from the date of receipt of representation, if any amount is found due, same be paid henceforth.

The contempt petition is disposed of.
