This order shall dispose of CRM-M-898-2019, filed by petitioner-Rajbir Singh and CRM-M-1023-2019, filed by petitioner-Tarun, under Section 439 Cr.P.C. for grant of regular bail in case FIR No.870 dated 14.10.2018, registered at Police Station Civil Lines, Karnal, District Karnal under Sections 384, 389 and 120-B of the Indian Penal Code.

Notice of motion has been issued in both these petitions.

Learned State counsel put in appearance on behalf of the respondent-State and contested these petitions.

I have heard learned counsel for the petitioner(s) as well as learned State counsel and have gone through the record.

As per the FIR, Rizwan son of complainant Khurshid was in relationship with one Raj Bala. An FIR was got registered against Rizwan for committing rape. Raj Bala went to the jail along with the complainant and asked for Rs.5,00,000/-, to be paid to the prosecutrix in that case and Rs.50,000/- was already given to Raj Bala. As the remaining money was not paid to her, she was issuing threat. The main accused is Raj Bala in this case.

The petitioners have been in custody since 14.10.2018. They are not required for any investigation or interrogation purposes as they are in judicial custody. The trial of the case may take long time. No useful purpose will be served by keeping them in custody till the final disposal of the case.

Keeping in view the facts and circumstances of the present case; without discussing the facts in minute detail and without expressing any opinion on the merits of the case, these criminal miscellaneous petitions are allowed and the petitioners are ordered to be released on bail subject to their furnishing personal bonds in the sum of ₹50,000/- with one surety in the like amount each to the satisfaction of the trial Court/Duty Magistrate.
