The present contempt petition has been filed for non-compliance of order dated 18.09.2017.

The petitioner is aggrieved with the fact that the authority has not decided the eviction petition within six months as directed by this Court vide order dated 18.09.2017.

Admittedly, out of six petitions, four have already been decided and two are pending. Just because the Deputy Commissioner has not been able to decide within the stipulated period, no cognizance of the contempt can be taken because there could be various reasons for the delay which may even be attributed to the petitioner and it cannot be said that the delay in deciding is intentional.

In view of the same, the present contempt petition is dismissed with costs of Rs. 10,000/- as the same being totally misconceived.
