This contempt petition has been filed pleading wilful
disobeyance of order dated 9.3.2018 passed in CWP No. 5816 of 2018.

The operational part of the order is reproduced below:

"3. Without expressing any opinion on the merits of the case, the instant petition is disposed of with the direction to respondent No.2-Chairman Punjab State Power Corporation Ltd. (PSPCL), Patiala to look into the grievances unfolded by the petitioner in legal notice dated 22.05.2017 (Annexure P-10) and to take a conscious decision in accordance with law, within a period of three months from the date of receipt of certified copy of this order.

4. However, if the petitioners still feel dissatisfied against the order passed by the concerned authority, they shall be at liberty to have recourse to the other remedies available under law as well as to approach this Court.

Reply by way of affidavit of Er.G.S. Guram, Senior Executive
Engineer, Operation Division, PSPCL, Nabha, has been filed today in
Court and the same is taken on record. Copy of the reply has been supplied

to counsel for the petitioner.

Learned counsel for the petitioners states that copy of the order has been supplied to the petitioners and they would avail the remedy for redressal of their grievance.

While disposing of the writ petition, liberty to avail remedy has already been granted to the petitioners.

The contempt petition is disposed of as infructuous.

The rule issued against the respondents is hereby discharged.
