This order shall dispose of three contempt petitions bearing No. 3075 of 2017, 2642 of 2018 and 2253 of 2018. The facts are being taken from COCP No. 3075 of 2017.

The contempt petition has been filed pleading wilful disobedience of order dated 29.2.2012 passed in CWP No. 6330 of 2003. The writ petitions were disposed of in view of the order passed in CWP No. 15199 of 2003 titled **Rakesh Beri Vs. State of Punjab and others.**

Learned State counsel states that the order in compliance of directions of this Court has been passed.

Learned counsel for the petitioner states that order has been passed and no cause of action survives for pursuing the contempt petition. However, learned counsel for petitioner seeks liberty that in case still there is any grievance, the petitioner would avail the remedy in accordance with law against the order passed.

In view of the above, petition is disposed of as infructuous with liberty as aforesaid. Rule issued against respondents is discharged.
