Sections 10 and 12 of the Contempt of Courts Act, 1971 are invoked pleading wilful disobedience of the order dated 2.5.2018 passed by this Court in CWP No. 10824 of 2018.

The brief facts are that the petitioner filed the writ petition seeking direction to the respondents (in the writ petition) to grant fitness certificate in respect of vehicle bearing registration No. HR-63B-1119.

The petition was disposed of directing DTO (Jhajjar), Bahadurgarh to consider and decide the legal notice dated 23.12.2017. The needful was to be done within three weeks from the receipt of certified copy of the order.

Reply dated 3.12.2019 by way of affidavit of Mr. Sushil Sarwan, ADC-cum-Secretary, Regional Transport Authority, Jhajjar at Bahadurgarh filed in Court is taken on record, copy handed over to learned counsel for the petitioner.

Learned counsel for the State, on instructions from Mr. Sushil

Sarwan submits that in spite of sending letters to the petitioner, he has not responded and completed the required formalities.

Learned counsel for the petitioner disputes the said fact.

To put an end to the controversy, let the petitioner remain present with required documents in the office of DTO (Jhajjar), Bahadurgarh on 17.12.2019 at 9.00 AM. The DTO shall consider the case strictly in accordance with law and do the needful. It is clarified that in case there is some reason for not granting fitness certificate, reasons in writing would be communicated to the petitioner.

The contempt petition is disposed of.
