The contempt petition is filed for non-compliance of the order dated 22.5.2013 vide which direction was issued to respondents No.2 and 3 to consider the impact of the decision rendered by the Court in CWP No. 17768 of 2012 on the order of compulsory retirement of the appellant as also on one of the adverse report and take an appropriate decision in the light of the observations made hereinabove within a period of four months.

Affidavit of K.K. Rao, Commissioner of Police, Gurugram filed on behalf of respondent No.2 today in Court is taken on record.

It is not disputed that the order has been complied with but the petitioner is aggrieved by the delay in granting the relief and hence, seek payment of the interest on the delayed payment.

In view of the above, this Court does not deem it appropriate to proceed with the contempt petition. Accordingly, the present contempt petition

is dismissed.

However, the petitioner is at liberty to file his representation with respect to the interest on the delayed payment.

If the same is moved within a period of two months from today, the respondents are directed to decide the same within a period of two months from the date of receipt of the said representation and if the petitioner is found entitled to the same, the payment shall be made within a period of two months thereafter.

The rule issued against the respondents is discharged.
