Reply by way of affidavit of Mr. A. Sreenivas, IAS, Director, Higher Education, Haryana, Panchkula filed today in Court, is taken on record and copy supplied to counsel for petitioners.

Learned counsel for the petitioners submits that though step up of pay has been given but the arrears are not paid till date. He further states that as there is delay in releasing the payment, the petitioners are entitled to interest.

As there is substantial compliance of order of this Court, the contempt petition is disposed of directing the respondent to credit the monetary benefits, in the bank account of the petitioners within eight weeks from today. Within the said period the respondent shall also provide the details of the amount found due to the petitioners.

The petitioners shall be at liberty to avail remedy in accordance with law if aggrieved of the calculation of the amount found due and for claiming interest on the delayed payment.

In case the payment are not credited in the bank account within

eight week, the petitioners shall be at liberty to revive the contempt petition and in case the petitioners are forced to revive the contempt petition, costs may be imposed which shall be recoverable personally from the defaulting officer/official.
