COCP-595-2017(O&M)

The present contempt petition is filed for non-compliance of the order dated 5.8.2016 vide which a direction was issued to look into the grievances of the petitioner as unfolded in his representation dated 28.6.2016 and if some substance is found to take appropriate action in accordance with law.

Reply has been filed. As per the same, the matter was investigated by the SIT and as per the said SIT no cogent evidence was led by the petitioner to substantiate his charges in relation to the complicity of accused in the commission of the offence. Further, the

allegations levelled by the petitioner regarding threats to his life at the hands of the accused did not have any substance. The said compliance report was filed way back on 4.3.2017. Copy was also handed over to learned counsel for the petitioner. Meanwhile, on the last date, time was sought. Much time has elapsed since then. No reply or rejoinder was filed. Today, learned counsel for the petitioner prays for more time to place on record more documents. The request cannot be accepted especially taking into account that only direction was issued to look into the grievances of the petitioner and if some substance is found to take appropriate action, if required.

In view of the reply filed by the respondent alongwith report of the SIT, this Court does not find that any contempt is made out. Accordingly, the contempt petition is dismissed.

Rule issued against the respondent(s) stands discharged.

However, the respondent is directed to look into the fresh documents placed on record by the petitioner in the form of his affidavit Annexure A-1 and photographs Annexure A-6. The petitioner has already supplied the photographs placed on record in this Court and, accordingly, deal with the same in accordance with law and also take action if so required on the basis of the said documents A-1 and A-6.

Since the main petition has been dismissed miscellaneous application is rendered infructuous and disposed of as such.
