The respondents have filed their replies stating therein that the order dated 21.4.2016 passed by the Division Bench has since been complied with and the petitioner has been granted appointment, promotion etc. and the initial benefits have also been given.

In view of the same, no contempt is made out.

Rule issued against the respondent(s) is discharged.

At this stage, learned counsel for the petitioner states that as per law, the petitioner is entitled for the monetary benefits and the arrears. However, there is no such direction.

Accordingly, in case the petitioner is still aggrieved in any manner, he is at liberty to file a representation seeking the said relief. In case, the same is filed within four weeks from today, the respondents shall decide the said representation in accordance with law within two

months of the receipt of the said representation by way of passing of a speaking order. Thereafter, in case the petitioner is found entitled to any such amount, the same shall be released to him but otherwise speaking order shall be passed which the petitioner is at liberty to challenge the same in accordance with law.
