This order shall dispose of the present petition filed under Section 439 Cr.P.C. for grant of regular bail to the petitioner in case FIR No.566 dated 14.06.2018 under Sections 323, 325, 307, 506 & 34 of Indian Penal Code, registered at Police Station Chandni Bagh, Panipat, District Panipat.

Heard.

Police file perused.

Sonu is alleged to have given land on lease to the complainant-Krishan and his brother Satbir. It is alleged that after one year, Sonu refused to hand over possession of the land to the complainant party. Then it is alleged that Sonu armed with gandasi and Sumit @ Amit-the present petitioner armed with lathi caused injuries to the complainant-

Krishan and his brother Satbir.

In this case, the injuries with lathi are attributed to the petitioner. He is in custody since 30.06.2018. In this case, both the injured have since been examined. Since the disposal of the trial will take time and the fact that no other case is pending against the petitioner, there is no ground for further detention of the petitioner. Accordingly, the present petition is allowed and the petitioner is ordered to be released on bail on his furnishing personal bonds in the sum of Rs.50,000/- with one surety of the like amount to the satisfaction of the trial Court, subject to the following conditions:-

- (1) Petitioner shall surrender his passport before the trial Court, if any, and shall not leave the country without prior intimation to the Court;
- (2) Petitioner shall not directly or indirectly give any inducement or threat or promise to any witness and
- (3) Petitioner shall attend the Court on each and every date of hearing before the trial Court and in case of his absence, trial Court shall be competent to cancel his bail.

Accordingly, the petition stands allowed.
