The present petition has been filed under Section 439 Cr.P.C. for granting regular bail to the petitioner in case FIR No.451 dated 20.08.2018 (Annexure P-1) under Sections 18/29 of NDPS Act, 1985, registered at Police Station Shahabad, District Kurukshetra (Haryana).

Petitioner is alleged to have supplied opium to the accused-Sanjeev and 45 Kg opium was recovered from the said Sanjeev.

On behalf of the State, it is alleged that the petitioner is involved in nine other cases of the similar or different nature.

Petitioner is in custody since 21.11.2018.

Considering that the recovery in which he sought to be made liable, is small quantity, merely, on account of pendency of other cases he cannot be denied the benefit of bail. Hence, the present petition is allowed and the petitioner is ordered to be released on bail on his furnishing personal bonds

in the sum of Rs. 25,000/- with one surety of the like amount to the satisfaction of the trial Court, subject to the following conditions:-

- (1) Petitioner shall surrender his passport before the trial Court, if any, and shall not leave the country without prior intimation to the Court;
- (2) Petitioner shall not directly or indirectly give any inducement or threat or promise to any witness and
- (3) Petitioner shall attend the Court on each and every date of hearing before the trial Court and in case of his absence, trial Court shall be competent to cancel his bail.

Accordingly, the petition stands allowed.
