SUDIP AHLUWALIA J. (ORAL)

1. The petitioner submits personally before the Court that he does not challenge the impugned decision of both the Ld. Courts below but seeks a reasonable time to vacate the demised premises from where he is running his commercial establishment.

2. In view of the above submission of the petitioner and considering that the eviction orders in favour of the respondent-landlord have been passed after holding that he is in personal necessity of the demised premises for the use and occupation of himself/his son for carrying on the business of General-cum-Grocery Store, in the interest of justice, while dismissing the present revision petition, the petitioner is granted time

to vacate the demised premises within a period of four months from today. During this period, any execution proceedings pending against the petitioner shall remain stayed. This order will thereafter automatically stand vacated from 31st May, 2019.
