The matter was referred for mediation. As per the report of the Mediator dated 24.05.2019, the dispute between the parties has been amicably resolved in the following terms:-

- “a) The third party will make payment of all the amount deducting loan amount of deceased Kulwant Singh as per procedure prescribed to the first party giving all benefits permissible as per the scheme of the bank and the second party will have no objection in that respect.
- b) It has been agreed between the parties that amount of LIC is also to be received by the first party and second party will have no objection.
- c) That both the parties further agreed that a sum of Rs.3 lakhs only by way of demand draft/cheque will be paid by first party to the second party on 29.07.2019 i.e. the date fixed before the Hon'ble Court and the second party will have no claim other than the amount aforesaid regarding service benefits and LIC amount and any other

amount of deceased Kulwant Singh. She will be satisfied with the aforesaid amount.

- e) That second party will withdraw the suit filed before the Civil Court on the date fixed. The children who are now major are living with the first party will not claim in the monetary benefits which will be given to first party and in any case the first party will be responsible for satisfying their claim if any. First party will take both children who are now major in the Trial Court for withdrawing the suit also.
- f) Both the parties agreed that the present Revision Petition may be disposed of on the aforesaid terms.
- g) It is further agreed between the parties that they will not file any civil or criminal complaint regarding this matter in any Court of law. By signing this Agreement the parties hereto state that they have no further claim or demand against each other with respect to the suit/claim/proceedings filed by them and all the disputes and differences in this regard have been amicably settled by the parties hereto through the process of Conciliation/Mediation and shall not institute any other case against each other with reference to the present claim.”

In pursuance to the afore-quoted terms, petitioner-Ranbir Kaur, has appeared in person and handed over four pay orders amounting to Rs.3,00,000/- to respondent No.1-Nirmal Kaur, who is also present in Court. Photocopies of the pay orders are taken on record.

Respondent No.1-Nirmal Kaur undertakes to withdraw her suit pending before the Trial Court on or before the date fixed before it i.e. 19.08.2019.

In view of the above, after directing that the parties shall

remain bound by the terms of the afore-quoted settlement arrived at between them, the present petition is disposed of as having been rendered infructuous.
