Present petition has been filed under Section 482 Cr.P.C. for directing the official respondents Nos.1 to 5 to protect the life and liberty of the petitioner as well as his family members and their employees at the hands of respondent Nos.6 to 8.

In response to the notice of motion, issued by this Court, reply by way of affidavit of Ramandeep Singh, Deputy Superintendent of Police, City-II, District SAS Nagar has been filed on behalf of respondent Nos.1 to 5. Perusal of the preliminary submission No.3 of the same reveals that both complaints of the petitioner were thoroughly enquired and ultimately, it was found that there is a property dispute between the petitioner and respondent No.6. Affidavit further reveals that petitioner is facing three criminal cases and which are as under:-

1) FIR No.204 dated 31.08.2017; under Sections 61/1/14 of the Excise Act, registered at Police Station Sohana

- 2) FIR No.119 dated 10.06.2018, under Sections 61/1/14 of the Excise Act, registered at Police Station Sohana and
- 3) FIR No.182 dated 06.08.2018, under Sections 61/1/14 of the Excise Act, registered at Police Station Sohana

Even during enquiry, no video clips, as alleged in the complaints, were submitted to the police officer(s), thus, the allegations made in both the complaints were found to be false and the same have been closed.

Since the petitioner is an accused in three criminal cases, as discussed above and both the complaints were thoroughly examined by the concerned police officer(s), but no substance was found therein. Still further, no video recording or clip, as claimed in the complaints, have been submitted by the petitioner during the course of enquiry, therefore, the present petition lacks merits and deserves to be dismissed.

Ordered accordingly.
