The petitioner Paramdeep Singh alias Raja has filed the present petition seeking regular bail in case FIR No. 9, dated 25.06.2018 under Sections 379-B, 392, 395, 216-A of the IPC and Sections 25 and 27 of the Arms Act, registered at Police Station Majitha Road, Amritsar.

Learned Counsel for the petitioner submits that the petitioner is in custody since 17.10.2018. The investigation has been completed and challan has been filed but the charge has not been framed as yet. The trial is likely to take long time. The petitioner was not involved in any other case of similar nature. No other case criminal case is pending against him. As per the prosecution version, co-accused Bablu and Navdeep Singh had snatched the bag and fired. The petitioner was not named in the FIR and he was named by co-accused

Ranjit Singh alias Geju and Navdeep Singh in their disclosure statements. Co-accused Ranjit Singh alias Geju has been granted bail by this Court vide order dated 29.01.2019 passed in CRM-M-45748-2018 (O & M). Therefore, the petitioner may be granted regular bail.

The application has been opposed by the learned State Counsel who has argued that there are serious allegations against the petitioner.

Keeping in view the facts and circumstances of the case, custody period of the petitioner, the fact that similarly placed co-accused has been granted regular bail and also that trial is likely to take long time but without expressing any opinion on merits, I consider it to be just and appropriate to extend the concession of bail to the petitioner.

Accordingly, the petition is allowed and the petitioner-Paramdeep Singh alias Raja is ordered to be released on bail on his furnishing personal and surety bonds to the satisfaction of the CJM/Illaqah/Duty Magistrate, Amritsar.
