This is a petition under Article 226 of the Constitution of India for issuance of a writ in the nature of Habeas Corpus for releasing the detenue Paramjit Kaur.

Notice of motion was issued and respondent No.3-SHO concerned was directed to visit the house of respondent No.4 and make enquiry as to whether detenue-Paramjit Kaur is residing there with her own consent or has been detained by respondent No.4 illegally and forcibly and to submit his report in this regard.

Status report has been filed by learned State counsel.

As per the report, SHO concerned visited the house of private respondent No.4 Rajwinder Singh, but he was not found residing there. Thereafter, he met private respondent No.5 and 6, who stated that detenue Paramjit Kaur and private respondent No.4 Rajwinder Singh had gone to Madhya Pradesh and married with each other. He has also produced copy of order dated 16.07.2018 passed by this Court in CRM-M-29389-2018, which shows that marriage has taken place between detenue Paramjit Kaur

and private respondent No.4 Rajwinder Singh, in which protection has been granted to them by this Court.

In view of report submitted by respondent No.3 and order passed by this Court, no further action is required in this matter.

Disposed of accordingly.
