Present petition has been filed under Section 439 of the Code of Criminal Procedure, 1973 (for short 'Cr. P.C.') for grant of bail to the petitioner, in FIR No.245 dated 14.05.2017, under Sections 392, 397 of Indian Penal Code, 1860 and Section 25 of Arms Act, 1959, registered at Police Station City Yamuna Nagar, District Yamuna Nagar.

As per prosecution case, on 14.05.2017, petitioner along with co-accused committed robbery in the showroom of the complainant at gun point and they were having muffled faces and fired gun shots, due to which, one of the persons present in the showroom, got injured.

Learned Counsel for the petitioner submits that petitioner is in custody since 11.05.2018 and has been falsely implicated in the present case and he has also not been named in the FIR.

On the other hand, learned State Counsel, on instructions from Sub Inspector Shanti, has apprised the Court that petitioner is facing six more cases of the similar nature.

Heard both sides and perused the paper-book.

Since the petitioner is involved in six more cases of similar nature and such incidents are increasing day by day, therefore, this Court does not deem it appropriate to release him on bail pending trial.

Accordingly, the present petition is dismissed.

The above observations may not be construed as an expression of opinion on the merits of the case.
