Prayer in the present petition filed under Section 438 of the Code of Criminal Procedure, 1973 is for grant of anticipatory bail to the petitioner in FIR No.27 dated 27.12.2018 under Section 498-A IPC, registered at Police Station Women, District SAS Nagar, Mohali.

Vide order dated 23.01.2019, arrest of the petitioner was stayed. Thereafter, vide order dated 27.02.2019, the matter was referred to the Mediation and Conciliation Centre of this Court and the parties were directed to appear before the Mediator on 08.03.2019.

Pursuant to the aforesaid order, parties have appeared before the Mediator and the settlement/agreement dated 19.03.2019 has been

entered into between the parties.

Learned counsel for the complainant-respondent No.2 does not dispute the factum of settlement/agreement.

In view of the fact that the matter has been settled between the parties before the Mediation and Conciliation Centre and the settlement/agreement has been reduced into writing, the interim order order dated 23.01.2019 is made absolute.

The parties shall adhere to the terms & conditions of the settlement/agreement dated 19.03.2019 in letter and spirit.

In case, the police finds that the petitioner is required in the present FIR, a clear 07 days' notice would be given to him.

The present petition stands disposed of accordingly.
