This is a petition for grant of anticipatory bail to petitioners No.2 and 3 under Section 438 Cr.P.C. in case FIR No.6 dated 07.01.2019 registered under Sections 382/323/506 IPC at Police Station City Abohar, District Fazilka.

Counsel for the petitioners states that the facts of the matter are that petitioner No.2 had contested the Municipal Corporation Elections of Abohar against the complainant and had won and it is only out of the frustration of having lost that this patently false case has been registered against him where as per him the allegations are that the snatching was done after the parties had reached the police station for settlement of the dispute.

Deputy Advocate General, Punjab has argued that the allegations are serious but though on instructions from ASI Krishan Lal she has admitted the fact that petitioner No.2 had defeated the complainant in the election.

In view of this chalked history between the parties, I do not deem it appropriate to deny the concession of anticipatory bail to the petitioner. Resultantly, the petition is allowed. In the event of arrest of the petitioners, they shall be released on bail to the satisfaction of the Investigating Officer subject to the conditions envisaged under Section 438 (2) Cr.P.C.

The petitioners are directed to appear before the investigating officer on 12.02.2019 and on any other date as and when their presence is required.

Since the main case has been decided, the pending criminal miscellaneous application, if any, also stands disposed of.
