Petitioner-Sarabjeet Singh has filed this petition under Section 482 of Code of Criminal Procedure for issuance of directions to respondent Nos.1 to 3 to present the final report under Section 173 Cr.P.C in FIR No.125 dated 21.10.2009 registered under Sections 324, 323 and 148 read with Section 149 of Indian Penal Code at Police Station Dasuya, District Hoshiarpur against respondent Nos.4 to 7.

Learned counsel has submitted that the FIR was registered in the year 2009 and till date no final report has been submitted before respondent Nos.4 to 7 who are accused in the said FIR. According to her, various representations have been given in this regard to respondent Nos.2 and 3. However, the same has failed to evoke any response from them. It is specific pleading in paragraph 5 of the petition that the complainant has come to know that Police has prepared a cancellation report, however, same is yet to be filed before the Court. The petition has been filed after a long

gap from the date of registration of the FIR and that too when the complainant has come to know that the final report is almost ready. Even otherwise, the complainant has a remedy to approach the competent Magistrate to seek the status of the investigation in respect of the FIR in question. Besides, the investigation is purely in domain of the Police and this Court cannot issue a direction to the Police to file final report against the particular accused persons.

In view of the above, no case is made out for invoking inherent powers under Section 482 Cr.P.C.

The petition is disposed off.
