[1] Learned counsel for the petitioners states that order dated 17.01.2015 passed by the learned Civil Judge (Junior Division), Gohana, allowing the injunction application and restraining the petitioner-defendants as well as proforma respondent No. 2 from dispossessing respondent No.1-plaintiff from the suit property as well as from interfering in his lawful and peaceful possession besides from alienating the suit property, till final decision of the suit was modified by the learned Additional District Judge, Sonapat vide order dated 15.10.2015 by disposing of the injunction application of respondent No. 1 plaintiff by directing both parties to maintain status quo, qua possession, alienation construction and nature of suit property till final decision of the civil suit and since the civil suit was listed before the learned trial court for rebuttal evidence if any and final arguments today, the petitioner would be

satisfied if the revision petition was disposed of by directing the trial Court to decide the civil suit expeditiously. The prayer of learned counsel for the petitioners is not opposed by learned counsel for contesting respondent No.1.

[2] In the light of the position as noted above, no useful purpose would be served by keeping the case pending, especially in view of the case now being at the final stage before the learned trial Court. Accordingly, the revision petition is **disposed of** by directing the learned trial Court to consider and decide the civil suit in accordance with law, as expeditiously as possible.

[3] However, nothing said in this order would be taken as an expression on the merits of the case.
