Having addressed arguments yesterday and today, learned counsel for the parties are now *ad idem* that this petition can be disposed of without setting aside the impugned order but with a direction to the trial Court to dispose of the suit finally within a specified period.

Upon query, both learned counsel for the parties are again *ad idem* that evidence has been led on both sides except to the extent of some documents to be still tendered by the respondent/defendants no. 3 to 6 and 7a to 7c, which they would do on the next date of hearing before that Court itself.

Learned counsel for the respondent/defendants further submits that the documents sought to be led by way of evidence are in the form of certain judgments in previous *lis* between the parties and consequently, no oral evidence would be required to be led in respect thereof.

That being so, this petition is disposed of with a direction to the

trial Court to finally adjudicate upon the civil suit before it within a period of one month from today, their already being an order of the Supreme Court dated 24.3.2017 to dispose of the suit within a period of 6 months from that date, but that not having been done for various reasons including the pendency of this petition for the past one year or so before this Court.
