Prayer in the present petition filed under Section 438 of the Code of Criminal Procedure, 1973 is for grant of anticipatory bail to the petitioner in FIR No.18 dated 22.11.2016 under Sections 406, 420, 498-A IPC, registered at Police Station NRI, District Amritsar City.

On January 29, 2019, this Court had passed the following order:-

“Learned senior counsel for the petitioner states that at this stage, the petitioner is ready to settle the dispute with the complainant. On his oral request, complainant Manpreet Kaur daughter of Bhupinder Singh, resident of Sarhali Kalan, District Tarn Taran is ordered to be impleaded as respondent No.2. Registry is directed to make necessary entry in the Memo

of Parties.

Notice of motion.

At this stage, Mr. P.B.S. Goraya, Advocate has put in appearance and accepts notice on behalf of newly added respondent No.2-complainant.

Power of attorney filed on behalf of respondent No.2 in Court today, is taken on record.

List on 08.03.2019.

Meanwhile, arrest of the petitioner shall remain stayed till the next date of hearing.

The petitioner and respondent No.2 are also directed to appear before the Mediation and Conciliation Centre of this Court on 05.02.2019. However, the petitioner shall pay a sum of Rs.50,000/- to respondent No.2 on her appearance before the aforesaid Centre as litigation expenses, which shall be a condition precedent for initiation of mediation proceedings.”

Pursuant to the aforesaid order, parties had appeared before the Mediation and Conciliation Centre of this Court. It has been reported by the Mediation Centre that the matter has been compromised between the parties. The settlement/compromise dated 25.02.2019 so entered between the parties before the Mediation Centre is made part of the record. The parties undertake to adhere to the terms & conditions of the settlement/compromise in letter and spirit.

Learned counsel for the petitioner has handed over a bank draft bearing No.503354 dated 06.03.2019 for a sum of Rs.5 lacs in favour of respondent No.2 in terms of the settlement to the counsel for respondent No.2.

In view of the fact that the matter has been settled between the parties, the petitioner shall not be arrested in the case unless there is any

violation of the terms & conditions of the settlement/compromise dated
25.02.2019.

Accordingly, the present petition stands disposed of.
