The matter was referred to Mediation and Conciliation Centre
of this Court.

As per report of the Mediator dated 10.07.2019 the dispute
between the parties has been amicably resolved in the following terms:-

- i) That both the parties have agreed to settle their
dispute amicably for a total amount of Rs.10,50,000/-
(Rupees Ten Lacs Fifty Thousand only), out of which
Rs.5,57,000/- (Rupees Five Lacs Fifty Seven Thousand
only) stands deposited in the Registry of Punjab &
Haryana High Court vide receipt No.57 dated
17.02.2017. The first party/petitioner will not have any
objection if the above-said amount of Rs.5,57,000/-

(Rupees Five Lacs Fifty Seven Thousand only) is released in favour of the second party/respondent.

ii) That so far as remaining amount of Rs.4,93,000/- (Rupees Four Lacs Ninety Three Thousand only), the first party/petitioner has paid the same by way of Bank Draft No.670959 dated 10.07.2019 drawn at Canara Bank, Sector 8-C, Chandigarh in favour of the second party i.e. Beltek India Ltd. and the above-said bank draft is duly received by the second party/respondent.

Iii) That the abovesaid amount of Rs.10,50,000/- (Rupees Ten Lacs Fifty Thousand only) is full and final settlement between the parties and since today onwards, both the parties will not file any claim or litigation against each other qua the present dispute. It is also agreed between the parties that claim of second party i.e. Respondent stands satisfied against first party-Surjit Kaur as well as M/s Nirmal Electronics as stated above.

iv) It is settled between the parties that the second party/respondent will withdraw the Execution Petition, if any, in terms of the present settlement.

As per aforequoted terms, the respondent has agreed to pay to the petitioner a full and final amount of ₹10,50,000/-. Out of the aforesaid amount ₹5,57,000/- has been deposited in the Registry of this Court and admittedly the remaining amount has been paid by the respondent to the petitioner.

In view of the above, the present petition is disposed of as having been rendered infructuous with a direction to the Registry of this Court to release the deposited amount of ₹ 5,57,000/- to the petitioner in the form of a demand draft.
