GURVINDER SINGH GILL, J.(Oral)

The petitioners have approached this Court seeking quashing of FIR No.106 dated 28.7.2016 registered at Police Station Lehra, District Sangrur under Sections 452, 323, 427, 506, 201 and 34 of Indian Penal Code, 1860 and all subsequent proceedings emanating therefrom on the basis of a compromise having been effected between the parties.

Vide order dated 6.2.2019, the parties had been directed to appear before the Illaqa Magistrate/trial Court so as to get their statements recorded qua the factum of compromise.

Report of learned Sub Divisional Judicial Magistrate, Moonak has been received, wherein it has been reported that statements of petitioners/accused Deepak Kumar @ Dimply, Manjeet Singh @ Jharlu, Krishan Kumar @ Krishana and Rohit Kumar @ Golu and also of

complainant Neeal Kamal have been recorded to the effect that they have compromised the matter amongst themselves and they have no objection in case the FIR is quashed.

The learned Sub Divisional Judicial Magistrate, Moonak has specifically opined that the parties have entered into compromise voluntarily without there being any pressure, coercion or undue influence.

In view of the aforesaid compromise and bearing in mind the law laid down by Full Bench of this Court in 2007(3) RCR (Crl.) 1052 Kulwinder Singh and others Vs. State of Punjab, the present petition is allowed and FIR No.106 dated 28.7.2016 registered at Police Station Lehra, District Sangrur under Sections 452, 323, 427, 506, 201 and 34 of Indian Penal Code, 1860 and all subsequent proceedings emanating therefrom are hereby quashed qua petitioners.
