The application is disposed of with a direction that the amount of Rs.50,000/- deposited by the petitioner towards litigation expenses, be released to respondent No.2-complainant forthwith against valid receipt.

CRM-M-5037-2019

Prayer in this petition filed under Section 438 Cr.PC is for grant of anticipatory bail to the petitioner in FIR No.9 dated 29.12.2018 under Section 498-A IPC registered at Police Station NRI Amritsar, District Police Commissionerate Amritsar.

Vide order dated 08.04.2019 passed by this Court, on the joint request of the parties, the matter was referred to Mediation and Conciliation

Centre of this Court. Accordingly, the parties appeared before the aforesaid Centre, where a settlement/agreement dated 17.05.2019 has been arrived at between the parties.

Learned counsel for respondent No.2-complainant does not dispute the very compromise so entered between the parties.

In view of the above, considering the fact that the matter has been compromised between the parties, the present petition is disposed of at this stage with a direction that in case the petitioner is required by the police, a clear 10 days' prior notice shall be served upon him and he shall not be arrested without prior notice.

At the same time, the parties shall be bound by the terms and conditions of the settlement/agreement dated 17.05.2019 and in case either party fails to adhere those terms and conditions, they shall be amenable to contempt proceedings.
