Petitioner has filed this petition under Section 439 of the Code of Criminal Procedure, 1973 for grant of regular bail in case FIR No.145 dated 12.07.2018, registered at Police Station Loharu, District Bhiwani, under Sections 306 and 34 of the Indian Penal Code.

Notice of motion has been issued. Learned State counsel has appeared on behalf of the respondent-State and contested this petition.

I have heard learned counsel for the petitioner as well as learned State counsel and gone through the record.

From the record, I find that earlier, the FIR was got registered by Sandeep regarding missing of his uncle Pardeep and later on, another FIR was registered on the statement of Sudhish, brother of

Pardeep. As per the allegations in the FIR, Pardeep lent out an amount of ₹18,50,000/- to Bhim Singh, ₹1,82,000/- to Dilbag and ₹1,10,000/- to Naveen. As per the prosecution version, Bhim Singh was not repaying the money and in this connection, Pardeep had also filed a case before the Court at Charkhi Dadri. As per the suicide note, Pardeep committed suicide due to these reasons.

The petitioner has been in custody since 23.10.2018. He is not required for any investigation or interrogation purposes as he is in judicial custody. The trial of the case may take a long time. No useful purpose will be served by keeping the petitioner in custody till the final disposal of the case.

Keeping in view the facts and circumstances of the present case; without discussing the facts in minute detail and without expressing any opinion on the merits of the case, this criminal miscellaneous petition is allowed and the petitioner is ordered to be released on bail subject to his furnishing personal bonds in the sum of ₹50,000/- with one surety in the like amount to the satisfaction of the trial Court/Duty Magistrate.
