MANOJ BAJAJ, J.

Petitioner has filed this petition for issuance of directions to respondents No.2 and 3 to get a fair and impartial enquiry on the application given by her to the SSP, Ludhiana, which relates to the alleged murder of her son namely Kulvir Singh.

Learned counsel for the petitioner has contended that petitioner's son namely Kulvir Singh, who was driver by profession, on 07.05.2015 left the house at about 7.30-8.00'o clock. Thereafter, at about 12.30/1.00, his dead body was recovered near Nanda Park. It is contended that post-mortem of the deceased was conducted, however, no action was taken.

Learned counsel for the petitioner has contended that the alleged disposal of the dead body by the accused was witnessed by one person namely Hans Raj, whose statement is appended as Annexure P-1.

However, the date of the statement is missing. The alleged complaint by the petitioner is given on 14.11.2018 which is allegedly after about more than 3 years from the alleged occurrence and in the said complaint, the petitioner has expressed suspicion upon five persons, however, there is no mention of any statement by Hans Raj.

Since the petitioner has the alternative remedy of approaching the Magistrate by way of complaint, no case is made out for exercise of inherent powers under Section 482 Cr.P.C.

The present petition is dismissed.
