Petitioner has filed this petition under Section 439 of the Code of Criminal Procedure, 1973 for grant of regular bail in case FIR No.201 dated 24.12.2018, registered at Police Station City Hoshiarpur, under Sections 379-B, 323 and 34 of the IPC and Section 325 of the IPC, added subsequently.

Notice of motion has been issued. Learned State counsel has appeared and contested the instant petition.

I have heard learned counsel for the petitioner as well as learned State counsel and gone through the record.

From the record, I find that as per the prosecution version, when the present petitioner alongwith co-accused Rohit was sitting in a bench on a fast food *Rehri*, a quarrel took place there suddenly. The

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petitioner picked up an empty liquor bottle and gave blow on the head of the complainant which hit above his right eye-brow. The petitioner also gave another blow to the complainant, which hit on his nose. The other injuries are stated to be given with fist blows. There is also allegation that the accused had also taken away ₹1200/- lying in the pocket of complainant.

The petitioner has been in custody since 24.12.2018. He is not required for any investigation or interrogation purposes as he is in judicial custody. The trial of case may take a long time. No useful purpose will be served by keeping the petitioner in custody till the final disposal of the case.

Keeping in view the facts and circumstances of the present case; without discussing the facts in minute detail and without expressing any opinion on the merits of the case, this criminal miscellaneous petition is allowed and the petitioner is ordered to be released on bail subject to his furnishing personal bonds in the sum of ₹40,000/- with one surety in the like amount to the satisfaction of the trial Court/Duty Magistrate.
