The petitioners have approached this Court seeking quashing of FIR No.19 dated 9.2.2017 registered at Police Station Bullowal, District Hoshiarpur under Sections 324, 341, 506, 148 and 149 of Indian Penal Code, 1860 and all consequential proceedings emanating therefrom on the basis of a compromise having been effected between the parties.

Mr. Nitin Verma, Advocate has today put in appearance on behalf of respondent No.2 and has filed *Vakalatnama*, which is taken on record.

Vide order dated 8.2.2019, the parties had been directed to appear before the Illaqa Magistrate/trial Court so as to get their statements recorded qua the factum of compromise.

Report of learned Judicial Magistrate 1st Class, Hoshiarpur has been received, wherein it has been reported that statements of

petitioners/accused Ranjit Kumar @ Babloo, Davinder Kumar, Mandip Kumar, Balwinder Kumar @ Bablu and Gopi and also of complainant Palwinder Singh have been recorded to the effect that they have compromised the matter amongst themselves and they have no objection in case the FIR is quashed.

The learned Judicial Magistrate 1st Class, Hoshiarpur has specifically opined that the parties have entered into compromise voluntarily without there being any pressure, coercion or undue influence.

In view of the aforesaid compromise and bearing in mind the law laid down by Full Bench of this Court in 2007(3) RCR (Crl.) 1052 Kulwinder Singh and others Vs. State of Punjab, the present petition is allowed and FIR No.19 dated 9.2.2017 registered at Police Station Bullowal, District Hoshiarpur under Sections 324, 341, 506, 148 and 149 of Indian Penal Code, 1860 and all the consequent proceedings arising therefrom are hereby quashed qua petitioners.
