Petitioners-Ashwani Arora and Ritu Arora have filed this petition under Section 438 of the Code of Criminal Procedure, 1973 (for brevity, 'Cr.P.C.') for grant of anticipatory bail in case FIR No.14 dated 23.01.2019, registered at Police Station City Rajpura, District Patiala, under Section 306 of the Indian Penal Code.

Notice of motion was issued in this case. Learned State counsel has put in appearance on behalf of the respondent-State and complainant has also appeared through his counsel.

I have heard learned counsel for the parties as well as learned

State counsel and gone through the record.

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As per the allegations in the FIR, Sania, wife of deceased-Deepak, was having illicit relations with one Mohit. The present petitioners are parents of Mohit.

Keeping in view the facts and circumstances of the present case; without discussing the facts of the case in minute details and without expressing any opinion on the merits of the case, I find that the petitioners have already joined the investigation and are not required for custodial interrogation. Therefore, no useful purpose will be served by sending them to custody. Finding merit in the present petition, the same is allowed. The order dated 11.02.2019, granting interim bail to the petitioners, is made absolute. However, the petitioners shall join the investigation as and when called upon to do so and shall abide by the conditions of Section 438 (2) Cr.P.C.
