Petitioner Jasvir Singh has filed this petition under Section 438 Cr.P.C. for grant of anticipatory bail in case FIR No.16 dated 26.07.2018, registered at Police Station NRI, District Police Commissionerate Ludhiana, under Sections 420/448/34 of the Indian Penal Code.

Notice of motion was issued.

Learned State counsel has appeared on behalf of the respondent-State and contested this petition.

I have heard learned counsel for the petitioner as well as learned State counsel and have gone through the record.

From the perusal of the record, I find that the main allegation in the FIR is that Jasbir Singh Barnala had taken the house on rent belonging to Sarabjit Kaur, but he is not giving the rent and not giving back the keys of that house to her. He is abusing and threatening Sarabjit Kaur.

In pursuance of the interim order dated 13.02.2019, passed by this Court, the petitioner has already joined the investigation. He is not

required for custodial interrogation. No useful purpose would be served by sending him to custody.

Keeping in view the facts and circumstances of the present case; without discussing the facts of the case in minute details and without expressing any opinion on the merits of the case, I find merit in this petition and the same is allowed. The order dated 13.02.2019, granting interim bail to the petitioner, is made absolute. However, the petitioner shall join the investigation as and when called upon to do so and shall abide by the conditions of Section 438 (2) Cr.P.C.
