Present petition has been filed under Section 438 of the Code of Criminal Procedure for grant of anticipatory bail to the petitioner in case FIR No. 223 dated 09.11.2018, under Sections 406, 420 of the Indian Penal Code and Section 13 of the Travel Professional Regulation Act, 2014, registered at Police Station Kartarpur, Jalandhar.

On 03.04.2019, the following order was passed by this Court:

“Ms. Ramneeq Kaur, Advocate has filed power of attorney on behalf of respondent No.2. The same is taken on record.

Learned Counsel for the petitioner submits that matter has been compromised between the parties and that fact is duly acknowledged by learned Counsel for respondent No.2, on instructions from her client, who is present in the Court today and duly identified by her.

Learned State Counsel seeks time to verify the aforesaid factual position.

Adjourned to 06.05.2019 for further consideration.

In the meanwhile, the petitioner is directed to join the

investigation before the Investigating Officer. In the event of his arrest, the Arresting Officer would admit him to interim bail in the present case till the next date of hearing on his furnishing adequate bail and surety bonds to his satisfaction. The petitioner is also directed to abide by all the conditions as envisaged under Section 438(2) Cr.P.C.”

It is contended by learned counsel for the petitioner that in terms of the order dated 03.04.2019, the petitioner has joined the investigation and the matter has been compromised between the parties.

On instructions from ASI Kabal Singh, the above factual position is duly acknowledged by learned State counsel and stated that the matter has been compromised between the parties.

Learned counsel for respondent No.2 submits that the matter has been compromised between the parties.

In view of the above, the order dated 03.04.2019 is made absolute subject to the provisions of Section 438(2) Cr. P.C.

Petition stands disposed off.
