Instant petition has been filed seeking quashing of the orders carrying even date i.e. 19.1.2018 (Annexures P-2 and P-3) and vide which the petitioners have been directed to appear in the examination of Bachelor of Ayurvedic Medicine and Surgery 3rd Year in May, 2018.

A writ of Mandamus is also sought for directing the respondents to permit the petitioners to appear in the examination of 4th Year which is to be held in June, 2019.

It is the contention raised by counsel that identically situated candidates/students had approached this Court by filing CWP-4650-2018 but which was dismissed on 15.3.2018. The LPA-760-2018 having been preferred against the order dated 15.3.2018 dismissing CWP-4650-2018, the LPA Bench permitted withdrawal of the appeal and liberty was granted to the appellants to approach the university by filing an appropriate representation and which was to be considered sympathetically.

The petitioners herein seek parity of treatment.

Without even ascertaining the correctness of the averments made in the petition, I deem it appropriate to dispose of the instant writ petition by granting liberty to the petitioners to approach the respondent-

university as regards their grievance/claim. In the eventuality of any such representation being preferred and if the case of the present petitioners is also at par with Piyush Sharma i.e. appellant in LPA-760-2018, the university would accord a sympathetic consideration.
