Prayer in this petition filed under Section 439 Cr.P.C. is for grant of regular bail to the petitioner in case FIR No.49 dated 22.10.2018 registered under Section 306 of IPC at Police Station Pojewal, District Shaheed Bhagat Singh Nagar.

Counsel for the petitioner states that the petitioner is in custody since 23.10.2018. The petitioner was married with the deceased about 13 years ago. Even before the deceased committed suicide, the petitioner informed his mother-in-law on 21.10.2018 making complaint against the deceased that she is fighting with the petitioner. Out of their wedlock, there are three children i.e. two daughters and one son and they are staying with the petitioner's family.

Learned State counsel, on instructions from ASI Roop Lal, does not dispute the custody. However, states that there are allegations of

constant harassment against the petitioner compelling the deceased to commit suicide.

I have heard learned counsel for the parties.

Considering the fact that the petitioner is in custody since 23.10.2018, the mother of the deceased was informed about the conduct of the deceased that she is fighting with the petitioner and the culpability is yet to be established during trial, this Court deems it appropriate to admit the petitioner on bail.

Accordingly, the present petition is allowed and the petitioner is admitted on regular bail subject to his furnishing bail bonds/surety bonds to the satisfaction of trial Court.

It is made clear that the petitioner shall not extend any threat and shall not influence any prosecution witnesses in any manner directly or indirectly.

The observations made hereinabove shall not be construed as an expression on the merits of the case and the trial court shall decide the case on the basis of available material.
