The present petition has been filed under Section 438 Cr.P.C. read with Section 482 Cr.P.C. for grant of pre-arrest bail to the petitioners in FIR No.108 dated 02.02.2019 under Sections 420, 406, 506, 120-B & 34 of Indian Penal Code, registered at Police Station Muradnagar, District Ghaziabad for a period of 15 days to enable them to seek appropriate order/protection from the regular Court.

The FIR has been lodged against the petitioners by Vivek Chaudhary-husband of petitioner No.1. Petitioner No. 2 and 3 are the father and mother respectively of petitioner No. 1. Petitioners No. 4 is her brother., Petitioner No. 6 is her maternal uncle and petitioner No. 5 is his son. Marriage of the complainant with petitioner No.1 was solemnized on 30.07.2016 at Chandigarh. Allegations in the FIR are that after marriage,

petitioner No. 1 resided with the complainant for some time. She left matrimonial home in February, 2017. While going away she stole jewellery and other articles from the matrimonial home. She has not since returned. Thereafter petitioner No.1 and her family members have been threatening the complainant.

Petitioner No.1 Supriya Singh, who appears in person states that the present FIR is a counter-blast to the FIR No.29 dated 22.06.2017 under Sections 498-A, 406, 506, 323, 377 of Indian Penal Code to which offences under Sections 120-B, 354-A, 420 and 34 IPC were also added, registered at Women Police Station Panchkula and FIR No.368 dated 04.08.2018 under Sections 323/506, registered at Police Station Sector-5, Panchkula. Those FIRs were registered at the instance of petitioner No. 1 against the complainant. The complainant was granted anticipatory bail in those cases. He has filed a petition for quashing of the FIRs, in which, the parties were directed to appear before the Mediation and Conciliation Centre of this Court vide order dated 30.01.2019, passed in CRM-M-28209-2018. It is contended that the allegations are totally false and are just to pressurize the petitioners.

In view thereof, this petition is disposed of. The petitioners are granted anticipatory bail for a period of 15 days so that they may appear before the Competent Court to seek appropriate remedy. During this period of 15 days, in the event of arrest, the petitioners shall be released on interim anticipatory bail to the satisfaction of Arresting/Investigating Officer, subject to the conditions provided under Section 438(2) Cr.P.C.
