It is not in dispute that the petitioner has filed an appeal against the order of assessment but without a prayer for equitable relief. Therefore, the present petition is totally misconceived as the petitioner would certainly have a remedy of making a prayer for stay etc. before the appellate authority. We would, therefore, not entertain the present petition in view of the specific remedy available to the petitioner.

In case the petitioner makes an application for any equitable relief before the appellate authority under law within a period of one week from today, the appellate authority shall consider the same in the manner prescribed in law and decide it within a period of three weeks thereafter. Ordered accordingly.

Petition stands disposed of.
